Introduction/Background	The New York State Education Department (NYSED) is soliciting information about local and regional shortages of special education teachers, bilingual special education teachers and teachers of students with speech and language disabilities (TSSLDs), and bilingual professionals in Pupil Personnel Service (PPS) titles and to gather information on school district and regional efforts to prepare, recruit and retain personnel with these certifications.
